# Barber Clippings

## Do You Joyfully Anticipate Your Next Problem?

During 1985, I worked on time management. I listened to a seminar on tape, took notes, did projects, conducted an inventory of time use, and concentrated on how to improve my use of a valuable commodity. One of the major undertakings was to work on my Unifying Principles. Mr. Charles Hobbs, the author of the tape seminar I used, said to identify the highest principles in your life, prioritize those principles, and then organize your time by those principles.

Principle nine is: patience.

Be patient. Grow in all adversity and unpleasant circumstances. Seek a lesson to be learned and character to be gained in every event in life. Guard against bitterness and resentment. In trials, develop longsuffering, contentment, joy, and anticipation - in that order.

I have not graduated from this principle. I hope I am growing some. Notice the progression in responding to trials:

**Longsuffering** - some things have to be endured. They aren't pleasant. I will have to suffer for a long time. I may suffer kicking and screaming.

**Contentment** - perhaps I can grow to the point of equanimity in every situation. One definition of the word *content* is "independent of external circumstances" (*Enhanced Strong's Lexicon*). My mood and outlook are not controlled by outside circumstances, but by inside convictions.

**Joy** - now I have grown to the point that I view adversity as an essential step for growth. There is still pain but it can serve a purpose in my growth.

**Anticipation** - this is a stretch. I look forward to the next growth-producing opportunity because I have experienced enough to know that God is faithful and will be with me in every event.

Where am I in this school of patience: freshman, sophomore, junior, senior? How do I respond to hurt: longsuffering, contentment, joy, anticipation?
