## PARENTING: Proper Planning Prevents Poor Performance!

The Peace Corps recruits people for “the toughest job you’ll ever love.” That description more aptly applies to parenting. But the effort invested is worth it all when you hear your child say “I love you” or you watch your son or daughter grow into responsible Christian adults.

Harmon Killebrew is one of the all-time great home run hitters in the game of baseball, and a few years ago he was inducted into baseball’s Hall of Fame. During his speech in the ceremony, he told about how his dad used to go out and play ball with him and the other boys all the time when he was growing up. And then he told how one day his mom hollered out the window to them, “You’re killing the grass!” His dad hollered back and said, “We ain’t raisin’ grass; we’re raisin’ boys!”

Too many today are leaving the “raising” to someone else. Nothing takes the place of time with your children. “Quality time” does not compensate for “quantity time.” Two observations gleaned from someone else helped me tremendously when raising our children. It was pointed out that if a father spent only one hour a week of uninterrupted, one-on-one time with his child from birth to eighteen, he would only have totaled the equivalent of thirty-nine days together. I certainly wanted to do better than that. The second observation from a book by Josh McDowell really hit home. He stated that “Rules without relationships are worthless.” We’ve all seen it happen as the kids grow older and tend to test their limits. If you have failed to build that relationship while they are young, your rules now that they are older will fall on deaf ears.

What can we parents do today to help our children tomorrow? PLAN:

- P - means to prepare for your times together.
- L - means to live each moment as if it will be your last together.
- A - means to act as if each time you have as a parent and child will be your last.
- N - means to do it now. Don’t wait until tomorrow or next week, because tomorrow may never come.

Proper planning prevents poor performance counts as much (maybe more) in parenting as any place else. Enjoy those kids. Spend tons of time with them. Who knows? When they are older, they just might enjoy spending time with you.
