Words Are Powerful!!

It is amazing what happens - for good or bad - when words are spoken. Feelings are excited - or depressed. Frustration is dissolved - or increased.

Ron Willingham, who taught many leadership classes, illustrated the power of words in the preface of his book:

One evening, Don Chaney, a young radio advertising salesman, stood in one of my classes and challenged the men with this question: "Who says that a picture is worth a thousand words?"

Then, before anyone could answer, he continued: "You give me a thousand words and I'll take the Lord's Prayer, the Twenty-third Psalm, the Hippocratic Oath, a sonnet by Shakespeare, the Preamble to the Constitution, Lincoln's Gettysburg Address, and I'll still have enough words left over for just about all of the Boy Scout Oath. Now would you trade these one thousand words for any picture?"

Well, Don had proved his point. At least, he convinced me of the importance of spoken words - and he convinced me with words. Now I'm telling you this to convince you of the importance of your words (*How to Speak So People Will Listen*, by Ronald Willingham).

I read the story of a plane taking off that was not accelerating properly. The pilot commanded, "Take-off power! Take-off power!"

The engineer misunderstood and cut off the power. The plane crashed and people were killed.

The command was changed to "Add power." People's lives were at stake.

I need to think about what I say and how I am going to say it. People's souls are at stake. Three questions may be helpful in evaluating what I am going to say:

1. Is it true?
2. Is it kind?
3. Is it helpful?

Honestly answering those questions before I speak would improve some of my conversation and eliminate much!

Memorial Day

Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service. There are many stories as to its actual beginning with evidence of organized women's groups decorating graves before the end of the Civil War. What is important is that Memorial Day was established and is about coming together to honor those who gave their all.

To help re-educate and remind Americans of the true meaning of Memorial Day, the "National Moment of Remembrance" resolution was passed in December 2000 which asks, at 3 p.m. local time, for all Americans "to voluntarily and informally observe in their own way a moment of remembrance and respect, pausing from whatever they are doing for a moment of silence or listening to 'Taps.'"

While we annually should and do gratefully observe Memorial Day, we as Christians are privileged to honor our Lord Jesus Christ's sacrifice for all mankind on the first day of each week (Acts 20:7). We have put on Christ in baptism (Rom. 6:3-5), which enabled us to reach His blood that was shed (Heb. 9:22) on the cross for forgiveness of sins, with Christ having redeemed us by His blood according to the riches of God's grace (Eph. 1:7). To eat of the Lord's Supper (I Cor. 11:24-29) is a memorial taking of unleavened bread and fruit of the vine so as to commemorate (honor) His death, burial, and resurrection. For when we eat the bread and drink the cup we are proclaiming the Lord's death until he comes.
